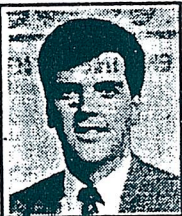

"The City of New York's recycling regulations for commercial buildings will require all building owners and tenants to take recycling seriously. Eleven separate items will need to be separated from the waste stream of every commercial premise over the next two years.
